Non-Family Service Allowance

For Staff



Internationally recruited staff members who are assigned to duty stations designated as non-family will be paid the non-family service allowance.



The non-family service allowance is a monthly allowance provided by the Organization to staff serving in duty stations designated as non-family. The allowance varies according to family status.

The allowance is discontinued if the duty station designation changes to a family duty station. It is adjusted for individual staff members when there is a change in dependency status.



The non-family service allowance is paid to encourage mobility to non-family locations and in recognition of the increased levels of financial and psychological hardship incurred.



When

The non-family service allowance is payable from the beginning of the staff member's assignment and for the duration of his/her service in a non-family duty station. The allowance is subject to discontinuation should the duty station designation change from non-family to family.

The designation of each duty station as family or non-family is maintained in reference tables in Umoja and will be automatically included in payroll once the HR Partner has processed the relevant personnel action to place a staff member in a duty station that is eligible for payment of the non-family service allowance.



Staff members do not need to take any action to initiate the payment of the non-family service allowance as the Umoja system will automatically generate the payment when a staff member is assigned to an eligible duty station.
