Language and Communications Training Unit (LCTU)


The LCTU offers language and communications courses in all the six official languages to eligible participants around the globe, on a variety of topics and at different levels.

While the LCTU encourages you to first look at courses offered by local UN training programmes in your duty station, here you will find globally available courses offered by the LCTU.



LANGUAGE LEARNING MODALITIES

Group live sessions

Students participate in real time in online or in-person discussions guided by a teacher. The sessions are focused on vocabulary, grammar, language revision, etc. Students get immediate feedback and answers to their questions.

Group interactive activities

Group exercises hosted on our learning platform that are guided/moderated by a teacher and do not happen in real time. Some examples are forum discussions or collaborative text drafting.

Individual learning activities

These individual exercises largely hosted in our learning platform do not happen in real time. They mainly help retention or offer learning strategies. Most of them are self-correcting.

Self-study

Learners complete the course on their own time and schedule, and completely independently. It is not teacher-led, and assignments do not have start or due dates. [Once you have registered for a self-study course, you must self-enroll in the learning platform to access your course materials. To access the learning platform, please follow these instructions.].
